Visa Requirement	 Foreign students seeking study in Korea should have a student visa(D-2) which can be obtained in the nearest Korean Embassy or Consulate. When applying for visa, students are required to submit "Certificate of Admission" which will be officially issued by Inha University Every foreigner, who wishes to stay in Korea more than 90 days, should be registered and issued an "Alien Registration Card" at the Immigration Office
	in Korea.
